Street Tree Planting Program – Fall 2025

The City of Windsor Heights is pleased to announce the return of its Street Tree Planting Program this fall. Later this August, residents will be able to sign up via the City's website to request a tree to be planted in front of their home near the street. Keep an eye out for the registration link on the City website and take part in enhancing our community's canopy! Tree planting projects along Hickman and replanting of trees planted in 2024 that did not survive are also expected to take place this fall.

Infrastructure Project Updates

It's been a very active season for infrastructure improvements across Windsor Heights. Thank you for your continued patience during this challenging construction period!

- Forest Ct.: The overlay project is now substantially complete, and Forest Ct. is open to traffic.
- Asphalt Patching: Public Works continues to conduct full-depth asphalt patching in areas with persistent pothole issues. These are temporary repairs, but more durable fixes until full street reconstructions or resurfacing can be completed.
- Wilshire Blvd.: Storm sewer improvements are planned for construction summer/fall of 2025 on the western half of Wilshire Blvd. The street will remain open during work, although intermittent spot closures will occur.
- 74th St. Reconstruction and storm sewer improvements: Storm sewer improvements in areas adjoining 74th St., including 75th St., are anticipated to occur late this fall. Reconstruction of 74th St. is slated to occur calendar year 2026.
- University Ave. Maintenance:
 - Restriping of all of University Ave. will occur in late August.
 - Asphalt sections are scheduled to be rejuvenated in early September.
 - University Ave. will remain open, with temporary lane adjustments during construction.
- 68th St. & University Ave. Intersection: Work is expected to wrap up at this intersection by early to mid-August, after which the University Ave. lane shifts will be removed.

73rd Street Reconstruction

This 6-stage project includes water main replacement, storm sewer construction, utility relocation, sidewalks replacement, street resurfacing, and driveway approach replacements.

- Stage 1 (North of University Ave): Traffic has shifted to the east side of 73rd St. Business access is being maintained throughout construction. Substantial completion is anticipated by late August.
- Stage 4 (Adjacent to Clive Learning Center): Crews continue to work six days a week in anticipation of reopening this Stage to traffic concurrent with the start of school at the end of August.
- Stages 2 & 3: In an effort to substantially complete reconstruction of 73rd St. this year, Stage 3 work is expected to begin by mid-August. If weather permits, Stage 2 will commence after Stages 1 and 4 reopen.

68th Street Reconstruction

- Stage 1 (South Section): This stage is paved and nearing substantial completion. School Street is open to vehicle and pedestrian traffic.
- Stage 2 (North Section): Underground infrastructure is nearing completion; work on this Stage is expected to continue into September.
- Stage 3 (Middle Section):
 - Mott Ave. work is tentatively slated to begin early/mid August.
 - 68th St. work is tentatively slated to start late summer, contingent on timely completion of Stage 2.

Irrigation & Restoration

At the time of drafting of this newsletter, the irrigation ban for commercial users is being gradually lifted. For the most up-to-date information, check out Central Iowa Water Works' website at www.ciww.gov. The City of Windsor Heights anticipates sodding 2025 infrastructure projects this fall, when weather is more favorable.

- Three active road construction projects are currently underway: 73rd St, 68th St. and an asphalt overlay on Forest Ct. from 64th St to 66th St. We also have an upcoming project along University Ave including pavement sealing and traffic markings. Help Keep Windsor Heights Beautiful

Windsor Heights is a great place to live, and we need your help in keeping it clean, safe, and beautiful as the season changes. If you notice a concern around town, let us know by calling City Hall at 515-645-6826 or submitting online report at windsorheights.org and selecting "Report a Concern" under the Residents menu. Here are some reminders of some seasonal code items to keep in mind:

- Keep your lawn mowed and free of trash and junk
- Clean up after your pets and keep them on leashes
- Keep your vehicles parked on pavement and not grass

From remotes and phones to power tools and toothbrushes, batteries keep our lives running—but improper disposal poses serious risks. Tossing batteries in the trash or recycling can lead to fires and chemical leaks, endangering workers and facilities. That's why we've teamed up with Metro Waste Authority to install a battery drop-off container at City Hall.

School Year Driving Reminders

- Take your time, SLOW DOWN, and watch for kids going to or coming from schools
- NEVER pass a school bus with flashing lights
- Be courteous to others in the area dropping off or picking up
- Do not park where you are blocking driveways, within 10-feet of an intersection, where you are blocking a crosswalk, or where otherwise posted

7/7/25 City Council Meeting Recap

- Council discussed how to improve the peddler and transient merchant permit regulations. This included consideration of the hours allowed, with concerns raised about the current regulations permitting activity too late into the evening. A consensus was reached on a time frame of 9:00 AM to 7:00 PM, Monday through Saturday, and 12:00 PM to 7:00 PM on Sundays. Discussion also addressed the permit fee and bond requirement. Staff will draft changes into the City Code as part of a comprehensive code review currently underway, which is anticipated to be completed by the end of the year.
- Council approved a 28E Agreement with the City of Urbandale, Iowa, which establishes a Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) to be managed by the Urbandale Police Department (UPD). The team will consist of one mental health professional and one specially trained, sworn UPD law enforcement officer. The team's duties include responding to mental health-related calls for service, performing de-escalation and needs assessments, addressing substance abuse and homelessness, and facilitating access to necessary mental health services for individuals.
