Andy's Corner!

- Two active road construction projects are currently underway. Major progress is happening! The intersection of 73rd St and University is now fully open. Work on 73rd St – Phase 3 is ongoing as is Phase 3 on 68th St. Check out the Projects Updates on our website for the most up to date information regarding all projects.
- **Road Project and Closure Map Link:** www.whroadprojects.com/
- **Wilshire Blvd. Storm Sewer Improvements:** This project is slated to begin this October and is expected to be completed before winter. The purpose of this project is to improve and repair the storm sewer in this area on the north end of the City.
- **Winter and Mailboxes:** If you have a curb side mailbox, now is the time to ensure it is installed with the specification of the United States Postal Service. Our department plows snow from curb line to curb line.
- **Storm Drain Maintenance:** Please be mindful as fall yard clean ups take place to help keep leaves and debris out of storm intakes and catch basins.
- Here are some other projects we've been hard at work completing:

 - Concrete Street Panel Replacement
 - Sidewalk Repairs and Inspections

Construction Updates

73rd Street Reconstruction

Reconstruction work has been substantially completed immediately north of University Avenue and in front of Clive Learning Academy. MidAmerican Energy is expected to complete re-energizing the streetlights on Bellaire and the new crosswalk across 73rd Street within the next couple of weeks.

Construction continues on 73rd Street from south of Del Matro Avenue to north of Sunset Terrace and is anticipated to be substantially completed by December, weather permitting. Once this phase is finished, the entire 73rd Street corridor will reopen for the winter. The final phase of reconstruction, from Sunset Terrace to City Wide, is scheduled to begin in the spring and continue into the summer of 2026. Reconstruction of 73rd St. south of University Ave. is tentatively slated in the City's capital improvement plan for 2030-2031.

68th Street Reconstruction

Paving of Mott Avenue (west of 68th Street) and 68th Street (south of Mott Avenue) is expected to take place in early October, with these sections reopening to local traffic later in the month. The remaining section of 68th Street under construction, located north of Mott Avenue, is anticipated to be substantially completed by December, weather permitting. MidAmerican Energy plans to relocate light poles along 68th St. in the spring 2026, after which the remaining sidewalk panels will be installed.

9/15/25 City Council Meeting Recap

- Held the public hearing of the leasing of 1151 65th Street to Nancy's Place and approved the rental agreement. Nancy's Place is a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing housing and support for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Nancy's Place will begin making necessary improvements to the dwelling this fall.
- Held the public hearing on the 2025 Tree Removal Project and approved an agreement for tree removal services with Wright Outdoor Solutions. The project involves the removal, trimming, and stump grinding of an estimated 19 tree on private property that were deemed to be dead or a hazard.
- Approved the proposed plans, specifications, and estimated cost for the Walnut Creek Access Project. This project is part of the larger planned ICON Water Trails project installing access points along multiple water ways throughout the metro. The City's access point will be behind the pavilion at Colby Park.
- Approved the application for a public art grant through BRAVO. The grant, if awarded, would be used towards the installation of a mural on the west side of 6587 University Ave. Plans and an artist are yet to be selected through a RFQ process.
