# Andy's Corner!

- Two active road construction projects are currently underway. 73rd St, 68th St. and a project along University Ave of pavement sealing and traffic markings. Please check out the Projects Updates on our website for the most up to date information regarding all projects. Road Project and Closure Map Link: [whroadprojects.com](http://whroadprojects.com)
- **Back-to-School Safety:** Remind drivers to watch for school zones, crosswalks, and bus stops as school is now back in session.
- **Street Sweeping Notice:** All streets in town will be swept this month and again before the end of the year. Street sweeping helps keep debris and contaminants from entering the storm sewers and eventually reaching our waterways.
- Here are some other projects we've been hard at work completing:

## Construction Updates

### 73rd Street Reconstruction

Stay up to date on all stages of the 73rd Street reconstruction project by visiting [www.wh73rd.com](http://www.wh73rd.com). In the coming weeks, Stage 1B (just north of University Avenue) and the remaining sections of Stage 4 are expected to reopen to traffic. Work on the active portion of Stage 3 will continue through the remainder of this construction season. The final stage is scheduled to begin reconstruction in spring 2026.

### 68th Street Reconstruction

The contractor is nearing completion of Stage 2 (just south of University Avenue) and is working toward substantial completion on the full project by the end of the year.

### 74th Street Reconstruction

Resident meetings for the 74th Street reconstruction project will be scheduled later this year, once a contractor has been selected. Reconstruction of 74th St. is planned to occur primarily in 2026 over three stages.



In case of a flood event, impacted residents can receive alerts through Alert Iowa. Residents and businesses in or near low lying areas are encouraged to sign-up for Alert Iowa using the QR code above. During a flood, anyone in flood prone areas should seek higher ground and if assistance, needed go to the nearest evacuation center such as the Giovannetti Shelter in Walker Johnston Park at 9000 Douglas Avenue, Urbandale.

## Share Your Feedback on the Future of Transit

DART is reimagining its transit network, and the draft plan is now available at [reimaginedartdsm.com](https://reimaginedartdsm.com). This new network is designed to make buses more frequent and convenient across the metro, and your feedback will help shape the future of regional transit.

For Windsor Heights, the draft plan means:

- Two bus routes serving our community daily.
- **Route 3:** Running along University Avenue into Windsor Heights every 15 minutes most of the day, 7 days a week. It continues to Drake, Valley West Mall, and every other bus extends to Jordan Creek Town Center.
- **Route 4:** A two-way loop with 30-minute frequency along 73rd Street. It connects Windsor Heights residents to downtown, the VA Medical Center, Grand View University, the Capitol Complex, and the East Village.

DART is hosting in-person meetings to gather input as well as an online survey. Public feedback is open until September 30. For more information on providing feedback, visit [reimaginedartdsm.com](https://reimaginedartdsm.com).

## 8/18/25 City Council Meeting Recap

- Approved Super Quick Mart liquor license. The store owner was present and made assurances that the store has implemented several processes to end sales to minors.
- Approved the 2025 Employee handbook with minor changes from the 2024 handbook.
- Approved the second reading of ordinance 2025-02, which aligns the City zoning code with state laws that went into effect July 1 of 2025 as well as makes minor typographical changes.

## 8/4/25 City Council Meeting Recap

- Public hearing for ordinance 2025-02, which aligns the City zoning code with state laws that went into effect July 1 of 2025 as well as makes minor typographical changes. Council approved the first reading.
- Discussion was held on uses for the city-owned property at 1151 65th Street. Uses included partnering with non-profit organizations and employee housing. Council was supportive of continuing discussions with Nancy’s Place, who work with individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- Dr. Michael Gossen, principal of Cowles Elementary, was in attendance to discuss concerns about traffic and pedestrian crossing. The city will continue to collaborate with the school to address these concerns.
- Council considered modifying on-street parking along 65th and 66th Street adjacent to University Avenue, switching parking from the west side to the east side. No action was taken with Council concerned about potential safety concerns the modification would create.
